49er Poker Run

September 7th has come and gone and so has our fundraiser - 49er poker run. Most of you remember that we have done several of these in the past with great success. The effort is always to help raise funds for our membership and our charities, and this year was no different.

On Saturday morning we set up the parking lot at C&E Auburn Indian and V-Twin and the first guests began to arrive before 9:00 AM. With the help of many of our chapter members, who we are grateful for, we had a plethora of raffle prizes. This obviously generated the purchase of raffle tickets by the event riders, which helped in our effort to raise funds for our charities. Gene Walker, Mike Riley and Jim Ketcherside staffed the raffle table. The weather was perfect, and registrants re-



ceived their poker score-sheet, map, ride-pin and raffle ticket at the registration tables. They were dealt their first card inside the store by Jerry Lucas and Steve Acuff. The riders mingled and met new and old friends and when they were ready, took off on our scenic gold country route. We had 75 registered riders.

This year's route took them north on CA-49 to Combie Rd, where Doug Williams and Monirith Min dealt out their second card at Subway Sandwiches. They continued along Dog Bar Road, up through Grass Valley and Nevada City. At Peterson's Corner (49 and Pleasant Valley Road) they stopped for their third card draw with Fred Carey and Tom Morris. From there, riders traveled south on Pleasant Valley Rd to the shopping area at the 76-gas station near Highway 20 where Doug and Sharon Cummings dealt out their 4th card. Their final journey took them back through Penn Valley, Lime Kiln Road and back south on highway 49 to the dealership where they received their fifth and final card.



Marc Moehlman and Dennis Gunter were our 'combat chefs' and served up burgers and dogs for riders and staff. Rey Sotelo and Tim Westmoreland from the Hope Motorcycle Rally were on hand with the prized Indian Scout to offer raffle tickets to win the bike. As the final event riders turned in their score sheets, the poker hands were tallied, and the winning hand went to Toney Byington with a full house hand 'A-A-A-2-2.' She received the \$300 cash prize.

We raised slightly over \$2,000 which will greatly benefit our two charities: cancer research with the Hope Motorcycle Rally and our Gold Country Toy Run. Cancer hit our Auburn Chapter and Hollister Chapter hard this year with the loss of our friends and members Melanie Riley and Dave Tozer; so this event meant even more to many of us. The Hollister and San Jose chapters rode up to

support our event and many of us will be attending the Hope Rally at the

end of the month.
